Semester	Winter term (starts at the beginning of October; ends at the end of January) Summer term (starts at the beginning of March; ends in mid-June)
Exam Period	Winter term (February) Summer term (mid-June – mid-July) In order to take an exam, students must apply in the ISVU system 3 days in advance. All exams are face to face, and students are obliged to take their exams before departure, to obtain the Transcript of Records at the end of their study period.
Student mentor	Each international student is assigned a student mentor from the Faculty of Architecture, a volunteer who can help the student overcome cultural and language barriers. The student mentor will help them settle in and learn about the Faculty and the city. They can also assist the student with organizational issues and the ISVU system.
Enrollment and Course Registration	Exchange students enroll upon their arrival in Zagreb (not before) at the Faculty of Architecture. They can register in Student Administration Office, room no. 61/ground floor (left). Language Requirements	B2 English (or Croatian) Most courses are taught in Croatian. Some courses for international students offer consultative teaching in English. Other courses for international students may offer consultative teaching in Italian, German, French or Spanish. Only up to 20% of all offered courses are taught in English – it is impossible to make 30 ECTS only in English!

Faculty of Architecture	<p>The Faculty of Architecture has been educating architects in Croatia for the past 100 years. Architects' education is provided through university study programs, research, professional and artistic work in the fields of architecture and urban planning.</p> <p>The Faculty aims to prepare young experts for the complex and demanding world of contemporary architecture and urban planning in an informed, creative and responsible manner. The study program of Architecture and Urban Planning introduces students to theoretical and practical knowledge of various relevant disciplines and encourages the development of creative and intellectual skills and reasoning. It also introduces students to the fundamentals and methods of scientific research and encourages learning through practical architectural and urban design. The Faculty of Architecture nourishes a long tradition of engineering professions, which are provided with artistic principles and considerations and introduced to work methods characteristic to the processes of architectural design.</p> <p>The study of Architecture and Urban Planning is a five-year program divided into two stages with the aim of achieving comparability, mobility and better development of students' interests. At the end of their studies, students will be awarded the title of Master of Architecture and Urban Planning, which responds to the needs of the society, relevant legislation, EU directives and standards of professional associations which award professional licenses.</p> <p>This study program implies a fewer number of lecture hours in favor of individual learning, i.e. it promotes intense work in design studios or workshops.</p> <p>The program is carried out by departments of Architectural Design, Urban Planning, Physical Planning and Landscape Architecture, Architectural Structures and Building Construction, and Theory and History of Architecture. They guarantee that all important aspects of the discipline are covered. Intense research work and numerous scientific and expert projects carried out in these departments ensure that they are up-to-date with contemporary scientific insights and related new knowledge and skills.</p> <p>Interest in the most recent developments in the field of architectural education is proven by cooperation with several European and American faculties and exchange of both students and teachers. Our study program is comparable to those offered by top European universities, such as ETH Zurich, IUA Venezia, RWTH Aachen, TU Delft and TU Wien.</p>
